Traditions with the Tree

Decorate the Christmas tree as a family. Play Amy Grant's Christmas music and sing along.

Scripture

Include a bible verse on your Christmas card to point to CHRISTmas.

♥ A Breakfast Tradition: Bayfield Eggs

1 1/2 lb. sausage

12 eggs

3/4 lb. cheddar cheese

1/2 lg. onion, minced

3/4 c. green pepper

2 c. mushrooms

1/2 tsp. salt

1/2 tsp. pepper

1/2 pt. whole cream

Fry sausage and drain well. Grease 9×13 pan. Break eggs into pan and poke the yolks. Top the eggs with sausage, half the cheese, onion, green pepper, and mushrooms. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Cover all with cream and the rest of the cheese. Refrigerate overnight. Bake 1 hour at 350 degrees.

Caroling with Joy

Get a group of friends together, kids included, to carol through the halls of a nursing home. Spread cheer to everyone.

Focusing on Loved Ones

Incorporate the whole extended family into the Advent calendar tradition. Purchase an Advent calendar with scripture. As each window is opened, reflect on the Bible passage. Next choose one member of the family—those who live near or far, including those who have passed away. Talk about what each one means to the family and then pray for the person. Focus on the communal nature of celebration.
